Bangladesh High Commissioner presents his credentials

The newly appointed Bangladesh High Commissioner to Australia Mr. M. Humayun Kabir has presented his credentials to the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, His Excellency Major General Michael Jeffery, AC, CVO, MC (Retd) in an official ceremony at the Government House in Canberra this morning. At his arrival at the Government House, the new High Commissioner was received by Mr. Noel Campbell, the Chief of Protocol, Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT).
