

A true story

Minul Islam (Shoeb), unlike most of other Bangladeshi people here, came from a lower middle class family. He is the eldest son of his parents. Shoeb got married to his wife (Mukti) before he came to Australia. For the first 3/4 years he was struggling to manage his tuition fees as well as he was trying bring his wife here but could not show enough money to sponsor her to satisfy the requirements.

Due to new requirements under amendments of immigration law, Shoeb only managed to fulfill the requirements to apply for his residency only. He did not add his wife in the residency application as he could not bring her to add her in the application.

Last year he went to see his wife. When he got back from Bangladesh, he was feeling severe headache. He went to see GP and he was diagnosed for 2 extraordinary disorders. I am trying to explain them in simple words.

- Shoeb was having trouble in water circulation inside his brain (between skull and brain) which was one of the reasons of his headache.
- Shoeb was suffering from internal bleeding due to twisted nervous system on the back of his brain which is the major reason of his problem.

Doctors were successful to establish water circulation within his brain in Westmead hospital which was actually only 10% of his actual problem. He recovered well this time.

But the second time, the operation was critical and this technology was very new to current neurosurgery. He went through several steps before he went for his operation. After the final stage, he could not recover properly and lost his senses completely. One good news, he got his residency before going to operation theatre.

After the last operation till now shoeb is still in wheelchair, can't talk properly, can't eat with his own hand. Recently his wife has given birth to their first child (daughter). We are trying to help him financially and socially. His wife got her tourist visa on medical ground after waiting for 4 months but unfortunately she does not have enough money for the air ticket. Now he is in St. Joseph hospital at Auburn under rehabilitation and waiting eagerly for his wife and unseen daughter.

Can we help this helpless new migrant who is unable to ask help by himself?
